The ideal candidate is someone who specializes in providing intervention and assessment services to children, adolescents and families and is able to work flexible hours including occasional evenings. Opportunities to work with adults and couples also exist. Familiarity with virtual technology (for telehealth sessions) is required. Our practice has developed a reputation for providing high-quality assessment and treatment services to clients of all ages, while also maintaining a collegial atmosphere that is well-suited to both early career psychologists and more established practitioners. Key responsibilities may include:

- Provide therapy to children and adolescent clients presenting with a range of mental health concerns, specifically children with ADHD, behavior problems, trauma, etc.
- Prepare clinical reports as needed and maintain up-to-date clinical records
- Provide sound clinical skills and adhere to professional and ethical standards of practice

Experience/Skills

- Proficiency in assessing and treating children and adolescents with behavioural and socioemotional problems.
- Experience with group therapy for children and adolescents would be an asset
- Experience conducting neuropsychological assessments with children and adolescents (including psychoeducational, ADHD, and/or Autism assessments) would be an asset
- Experience working with diverse populations

Requirements:

- Ph.D. or Psy.D. in Clinical Psychology with competencies in assessment and treatment of children, adolescents, and family. Competency in neuropsychology is an asset.
- Currently licensed by and in good standing with the College of Psychologists of Ontario.

- Strong clinical assessment and treatment skills with children and adolescents
- Fluency in English (second language is an asset)
